Dear City of New York employee,

You may have recently received a letter from Memorial Sloan Kettering (MSK) regarding their negotiations with the City's insurer for hospital benefits, Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield (Anthem). It was disturbing to the City and the Municipal Labor Committee that MSK chose to involve patients in their negotiations with an insurer, and we are writing to clear up some of the misinformation and confusion caused by the letter.

Anthem is negotiating with MSK to continue their agreement for 2025 and beyond. Provider contract renewals are a routine and normal part of the health care industry, and typically, these negotiations settle close to the renewal date. The City is optimistic that Anthem and MSK will reach a new agreement before the current contract ends on January 1, 2025. However, you should be aware that MSK failed to mention in their letter that New York law requires both Anthem and MSK to honor the terms of their contract until at least March 1, 2025. Additionally, in the unlikely event that MSK exits Anthem's network, there is an agreement that ensures that all patients who begin treatment before March 1, 2025, will maintain their benefit coverage at MSK for the entire duration of their treatment.

You should also be aware that these negotiations do not apply to retirees in the Senior Care plan since Medicare is the primary payor.

If you are undergoing treatment at MSK please continue as you have in the past. Anthem has set up a website at Anthem.com/MSKCONY with information on the negotiations. That site will be updated as negotiations continue. You can also contact Anthem Member Services at the number on your ID Card.

Be assured that we are monitoring the situation closely and will keep you informed.

A letter from Emblem Health should be going out sometime in October instituting the \$15 Copay effective Jan 1, 2025. The reason for this is that Judge Frank's Injunction was lifted when Emblem Added it to their documents.

The case is still being appealed and and the class action status are still in effect. Oral arguments concerning this case will be heard on Oct 17, 2024 at 60 Centre Street.





Because the City revised the Emblem contract, the Judge lifted the stay on the copays. This means that beginning January 2025, we will most likely see copays. There is no ending date to the contract, it expires when the City goes to change it. This is another gift of the MLC under the leadership of DC37 and the UFT, and its chair Harry Nespoli. Copays in this contract are \$15. We will keep you posted when more information comes out of OLR on these changes. But please be patient, as the meat and potatoes of the case has not yet been argued. This is just the stay that has been lifted... and the City has not put out anything on this yet, but since open enrollment is around the corner - we will be watching.

#### **Retiree Program**

In 2006, POPPA started its Retiree Program. The program began with 26 retired NYPD officers dedicated to help meet the needs of fellow retired police officers. The mental health and other unique needs of this group are often overlooked. Retired police officers can use POPPA services for a variety of stress or mental health issues, relationship problems, substance use, or if they feel suicidal. Sometimes, retirees just need to reconnect with another person who can identify as a law enforcement peer.

The Retiree Program has grown to more than 100 volunteers spanning several states across the country in addition to New York.
